



Transition News

The Salinas season is quickly coming to an end. We will start loading Yuma on the week of the 20th. Most of the processors are staying until then, which is a good sign that the raw product is holding up well.

Normally around this time we start to see the fatigue of the plants from a long season which has seen its share of weather, especially heat. Mainly it pops up in the baby lettuces first. So far the only issue arisen has been in the baby and wild arugula as this is by far the most sensitive item to hot and cold. The broccoli and cauliflower are starting to gap but the quality on those and all the leaf has been very good. Most iceberg has finished in Salinas and moved down to Huron but again quality is holding great.

We are expecting overlapping crops this year which should protect us from any price spikes excluding cauliflower and broccoli.
